Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior,

It's not a bad splinter, but each time I press down on my keyboard I can feel it. I received said splinter yesterday as I was moving a piece of furniture at my house to make room for a different couch. The silly part is, I had my gloves on a table right next to this piece of furniture and I just didn't put them on. If I had, I would not be dealing with this

splinter in my finger.

I am what my wife calls a 'splinter magnet,' because it seems any time I am around a piece of wood, I get a splinter. Even if this wood is finished and smooth, I will find the bad part. 
